### DEAR LIVEGIRL COMMUNITY,



I am immensely proud to share with you our 2019 Annual Report, encapsulating our program accomplishments and how we're changing the game — made possible because of you. Founded in 2014, LiveGirl's impact has grown exponentially every year.

In 2019, we served 1,420 girls in our free-of-charge leadership development and mentoring programs, 65% being girls of color. Our evidence-based programs equip these young women with the leadership skills they need to thrive in today's world. We have expanded our programs in grades 5 thru 12 and launched a new high school leadership program — LiveGirl League. This program creates an inspiring "ripple effect," as our confident leaders are now making positive changes in their local communities. Last year, we also launched *Confident* - a podcast - and other digital resources to reach any girl, anywhere, anytime she needs us. In recognition of our impact, we were delighted to be honored by Moffly Media as their *Best Friend to Girls* recipient of the 2019 Light a Fire awards.

And we are just getting started! To position us for the future, our Board recently completed a strategic planning process with a professional consultant. Our five-year strategic plan provides the necessary foundation for powerful growth to expand both our reach and impact and to realize our goal of being a best-in-class girls' leadership organization. We are more committed than ever to our mission — because today, when girls have more opportunities than ever before — when we should be seeing the next generation of female leaders rise — we are instead in the midst of a growing mental health and confidence crisis. Never before have girls reported such high levels of feeling overwhelmed, stressed, sleep deprived, anxious, and depressed.

This is why we need your continued support — so that girls may develop the confidence and courage necessary to realize their best selves. Your belief that EVERY girl deserves a chance to lead is what sustains us. Together, we will build confident leaders and arm girls with the resilience to not give up. This is how our girls will reach their full potential — and our society, too.

LiveGirl's mission is to empower and equip the next generation of brave, inclusive leaders with the skills, community, and connections so that ALL girls may thrive and make a positive impact on their local community and the world.

We build diverse and inclusive leaders ready to make positive change in their local communities and the world. We provide the power of community including access to fierce female role models. We focus on skill development that breeds confidence, including public speaking, conflict resolution, networking, advocacy, and activism. We create BRAVE SPACES where adults are listening to young people on the issues they care about. The positivity and sisterhood of the LiveGirl community can be THE difference in a young woman's life.

## **ABOUT US**



### WHO WE SERVE

In 2019 alone, LiveGirl enrolled **1,420** young women in its free-of-charge programming and is currently expanding Confidence Clubs statewide through the CT Alliance of Boys & Girls Clubs. **65%** of our participants are girls of color and **70%** are from underserved zip codes.

### 21ST CENTURY LEADERSHIP MODEL

- **STARTS** working with girls in middle school, which research has shown is the most critical time in a young person's development.
- **UTILIZES** evidence-based programs that build self-esteem and socialemotional intelligence - the building blocks of a confident leader.
- **PROVIDES** sisterhood and a diverse community where girls can learn the skills necessary to navigate the teen years.
- COACHES girls to set aside their perfectionism and take risks.
- EMPOWERS girls to embrace their true selves and find their voice.

### **OUR IMPACT**

91.8% feel empowered to be her true self because of LiveGirl 91% know how to deal with conflict (70% pre-program) 85.9% feel brave because of LiveGirl 83.5% learned the power of her voice 82.3% feel confident as a leader (64.9% pre-program)



## WHY LIVEGIRL?

### To address the growing levels of stress and anxiety in teen girls:

- 7 in 10 girls believe they are not good enough and don't measure up in some way.
- 75% of girls with low self-esteem reported engaging in negative activities like cutting, bullying, smoking, drinking, or disordered eating.
- Between ages 8 and 14, girls' confidence levels drop by 30%.
- 46% of girls do not believe they are smart enough for their dream career.
- 1 in 2 girls don't disagree with others, nor say what they are thinking because they want to be liked.
- Adolescent girls are experiencing stress, anxiety, and depression at twice the rate of boys. The CDC has reported that teen girl **suicide rates are increasing** at an "alarming pace."

## To address girls' lack of confidence, which deters them from pursuing leadership; provide confidence-boosting skill development:

- Provide **critical skill development**, including public speaking, conflict resolution, assertive communication, problem-solving, networking, self-advocacy, and goal-setting.
- Provide **safe spaces**, because less than 4% of teen girls will talk to a parent, teacher, or counselor when feeling sad, anxious, or depressed.
- Girls who have a mentor are 130% more likely to hold a leadership position in their career.
- 89% of young women set more ambitious life goals when they have access to female role models.

### To address the female leadership gap:

- Women outperform men academically: 57% of US college degrees now go to women; the majority of valedictorians are women; and women have, on average, higher GPAs.
- However, women make up just 5% of Fortune 500 CEO positions and only 20% of governmental leadership positions.
- Only 1 in 5 C-suite members are women and only 1 in 25 are women of color.

The middle school leadership summit was held at the Wakeman Boys & Girls Club in Bridgeport and brought together 75 girls from neighboring Boys & Girls Clubs including Greenwich, Milford, Naugatuck Valley, Stamford, and Waterbury.

### JUNIOR LEAGUE OF STAMFORD NORWALK







LiveGirl and the Junior League of Stamford-Norwalk (JLSN) are thrilled to announce the launch of a new leadership program for high school women.
